About Fishing for Schools

Fishing for Schools is a programme for 10–16-year-olds that uses fishing as a platform to engage and inspire an enjoyment of learning and nature. Over 4,000 disadvantaged young people at over 150 schools have benefitted from Fishing for Schools over the last 17 years.

Founded by world renowned fly fisherman, Charles Jardine, Fishing for Schools connects with hundreds of young people annually. Using a blend of outdoor learning and classroombased activities we use fishing as a platform to develop a wide range of life skills, including communication, teamwork, problem solving and resilience.

Fishing for Schools is offered at no cost to schools or the young people taking part. We have supported young people across 30 counties in England and seven in Wales.

Our beneficiary schools

- Our schools came from England, Wales and Northern Ireland.
- We delivered to five primary schools, nine secondary schools, three alternative provisions and twelve special schools.
- Nine schools took part for the first time during 2024.
- A quarter of schools were from the 30% most deprived neighbourhoods in England.
